Madison is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in this district. To this end, we want to establish partnerships with parents and with the community. Everyone gains from Madison Elementary Staff and families working together to promote high achievement by our children. Neither home nor the school can do the job alone. Parents play an extremely important role as children's first teachers. Support for their children and for the school is critical to children's success at every step along the way.

Madison Staff recognizes that some students may need the extra assistance available through the Title I program to reach the state's high academic standards. Madison Elementary intends to include parents in all aspects of the school's Title I program. The goal is a school-home partnership that will help all students to succeed.

A. We meet with families in both evening, morning and throughout the day. Childcare is provided when possible. At Madison Elementary we also do numerous home visits for a variety of reasons.

We provide parents the opportunity to meet with staff to review the school improvement plan. We also share it in a variety of ways through a link on our website and monthly newsletters.

- 1. Teachers are available to meet with parents prior to and at the end of each school day. Teaching staff also have conferences twice yearly with all parents.

- Families are encouraged to meet with their teachers when any concerns arise around the academic, social or emotional success of their student.

Parent teacher conferences are held twice a year formally. However, parents and teachers conference throughout the year as needed to discuss student progress.

Parents are invited to volunteer and connect with the school community through a variety of events, in classroom experiences and welcome to be in the school throughout the day.

- Ensuring regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand. *We have a variety of ways to communicate between school and home. When communicating with families, we offer support in language translation both verbally and in writing.*

<u>BUILDING CAPACITY FOR PARENTS AND STAFF – REQUIREMENTS FOR ENGAGEMENT</u> To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, **each school and district must**:

1) Assist parents in understanding the challenging State academic standards, how to monitor a child's progress, and work with educators.

Parents are provided the progress of their student on both state and local assessments. Parents have access to students' progress through meeting with teachers.

2) Provide materials and training to help parents to work with their children, such as literacy training and using technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy). *Parents are provided materials at conferences, family engagement nights and Parent Teacher Organization meetings. Teachers present ways to assist their children at PTO meetings, conferences and family nights. Family Academies occur once per year, where families learn about how to access Skyward Information, attendance policies, mental health supports and ways to assist their students in being successful academically.*

3) Provide professional development to teachers, specialized instructional personnel, and other staff on the value of parents and their communities to increase academic achievement. Staff are trained on how to conference with families in an engaging way, where they are learning about the families. Part of our equity work has had a focus on our engagement with the community and our families and through this engagement students are able to increase their academic achievements.

4) Coordinate and integrate parent engagement programs and activities with other Federal,
 State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities,
 such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parent engagement.
 Our students and families have access to parent academies, after school programs (YMCA, Boys and Girls Club, and Children of the Valley), and we connect families with

family resources at Catholic Community Services, Compass Health, Consejo, and Seamar.

5) Ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents of participating children in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.

All documents are translated and available in English, Spanish and Russian.

6) May involve parents in the development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of such training.

We train parents to train other parents in how to be involved during our parent academies.

10) May arrange school meetings at a variety of times, or conduct in-home conferences between teachers or other educators, who work directly with participating children, with parents who are unable to attend such conferences at school, in order to maximize Parent and Family Engagement and participation.

We arrange school meetings before and after school. We also have home visits to provide families with the opportunity to conference on their students.

11) May adopt and implement model approaches to improving Parent and Family Engagement.

12) May establish a district parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters related to Parent and Family Engagement in programs supported under this section *We have two PAC family representatives that meet monthly and help to plan our family engagement events. These families also attend our PTO meetings and Parent*

13) May develop appropriate roles for community-based organizations and businesses in Parent and Family Engagement activities.

We connect with Catholic Community Services, Children of the Valley, Compass Health, Consejo, Community Action, and our local food bank.
