WASHINGTON STATE LAW allows parents to keep sunscreen at school for their student without having an order from a doctor. However, because teachers may not always be able to apply the sunscreen, parents wishing to have sunscreen at school for their student must teach their student how to apply it safely. Parents should ensure that their student is not allergic to the ingredients found in sunscreen, and should teach their student to apply sprayed sunscreen away from others so that it does not trigger asthma symptoms or get into the eyes of another student. The law states that the school will not incur responsibility for any injury that may occur because of sunscreen application.
